Re: Consideration – Adoption of the Fiscal Year 2013-2014 Budget

Ordinance

## **BACKGROUND:**

The City of Elizabeth City began the fiscal year 2013-2014 budget process on February 25, 2013 with a pre-budget work session. On April 15, 2013, I presented to the City Council the Manager's Recommended Budget pursuant to NCGS § 160A-147. The City Council discussed the FY 2013-2014 budget during four budget work sessions and the Finance Committee held an additional two meetings to discuss the budget and make recommendations to the full City Council.

Attached, you will find a copy of the FY 2013-2014 Budget Ordinance, which reflects the changes the City Council made to the Manager's Recommended Budget. The City is anticipating revenues in the General Fund of \$20,291,972, \$39,945,909 in the Electric Fund, \$9,370,137 in the Water and Sewer fund and finally \$1,421,506 in the Storm Water Utility Fund. The total amount of revenue reflected in the fiscal year 2013-2014 budget is \$71,029,524. This amount is reduced for inter-fund payments of \$1,950,000. The net amount of revenue anticipated is \$69,079,524.

State law requires the City to have a balanced budget; therefore, the expenditures in the General Fund, Electric Fund, Water and Sewer Fund and Storm Water Fund reflect the available revenue. The net expenditures will be \$69,079,524.

The City's tax levy for fiscal year 2013-2014 will be \$.495 per \$100 of valuation, the same amount we presently levy. The valuation is estimated to be \$1,392,617,665. The Municipal Service District tax for properties located within the downtown district will continue to be \$.06 per \$100 of valuation. The City Council authorized a 1.5% COLA for all City employees, along with a 1% Christmas Bonus and continuation of our existing longevity bonus plan. The City Council did authorize staff to switch our health insurance coverage from the

North Carolina League of Municipalities to Blue Cross/Blue Shield. The Council increased the sanitation fee from \$17 per month to \$20 per month, which will raise an additional \$210,000 annually. The surcharge of \$.43 per 1,000 gallons of water used will continue. Finally, the City of Elizabeth City's fee schedule will be readopted.

## ANALYSIS:

The Council held the required public hearing on the proposed budget ordinance during the June 10, 2013 City Council meeting. During that meeting, some members of the Council indicated that more information was needed from staff regarding the budget prior to its adoption. Staff has not received any requests for additional information.

During the Finance Committee meeting held on June 19, 2013, a discussion was held regarding placing a line item in the budget for Arts of the Albemarle during fiscal year 2013-2014. However, the Finance Committee decided to recommend that \$15,000 be provided to AoA by using funding from the Tourism Development Authority. A separate staff memo has been included on this agenda requesting authorization to submit that application to TDA.

## STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

By motion, adopt the fiscal year 2013-2014 Budget Ordinance as presented herein.

SECTION 1. It is estimated that the following revenues will be available for the City of Elizabeth City for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2013 and ending June 30, 2014:

SECTION 3. There is hereby levied a tax at the rate of \$.495 per \$100 valuation of property as listed for taxes as of January 1, 2013 for the purpose of raising the revenue listed as "Current Year's Property Taxes" as set forth in the foregoing estimates of revenue and a motor vehicle fee of \$5.00 per vehicle.

The tax rate is based on an estimated total valuation of property for the purpose of taxation of \$1,392,617,665 and an estimated rate of collection of 94 percent.

SECTION 4. There is hereby levied a tax at the rate of \$.06 per \$100 valuation of property listed for taxes as January 1, 2013 located within the Municipal Service Tax District.

SECTION 5. That an increase of 1.5 percent cost of living adjustment be established for City payroll.

SECTION 6. That a Christmas bonus of 1 percent be given.

SECTION 7. That a longevity bonus plan be continued.

SECTION 8. That the health insurance coverage be authorized with Blue Cross & Blue Shield of North Carolina.

SECTION 9. That sanitation fee be increased to \$20 monthly.

SECTION 10. That a surcharge of \$.43/1,000 gallons of water usage be continued.

SECTION 11. That the City of Elizabeth City fee schedule be adopted by reference.

SECTION 12. The Budget Officer shall be authorized to reallocate departmental appropriations among the various expenditures within each department.

SECTION 13. Outstanding purchase orders and projects as of June 30, 2013, are hereby re-appropriated to this budget.

SECTION 14. All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
