**Re:** Consideration – Adoption of Resolution in Support of Governor McCrory's Connect NC Bond Initiative

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## **BACKGROUND:**

As City staff reported to you earlier, we received information from Governor McCrory's office on April 29, 2015 regarding the proposed \$2.85 billion bond proposal that the Governor is advocating. This bond issue, which has been named "Connect NC," addresses many infrastructure issues throughout the State of North Carolina including roads, rail, parks, public health, education, technology and military installations. The bond issue would not require a tax increase.

## **ANALYSIS:**

As City staff has stated several times in past months, since interest rates are as low as they are right now, it is a great time to borrow money. I have attached the package of information we received from Governor McCrory's office, which details the projects proposed to be funded by the Connect NC bond issue. Please note that the projects that benefit Elizabeth City include \$4 million to ECSU for repairs and renovations on campus and \$10 million to the Coast Guard to help build a paint and strip hangar at the Aviation Park.

Mayor Peel wrote a letter to Governor McCrory on April 29, 2015 pledging his support for Connect NC (attached). The Governor's office is requesting the City Council's support for the Connect NC bond proposal through adoption of a resolution. Staff has prepared a resolution for the Council's consideration (attached).

## **STAFF RECOMMENDATION:**

By motion, adopt the attached resolution in support of the Connect NC Bond Proposal and direct staff to provide a copy to our Legislative Delegation and Governor McCrory as soon as possible.

**WHEREAS**, the citizens of North Carolina must be allowed to make the important decision of investing in the opportunities provided to our future generations through the Connect NC bond initiative.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Mayor and City Council of the City of Elizabeth City support Governor McCrory's Connect NC bond initiative and encourage the General Assembly to allow North Carolina's citizens to vote on this critical bond proposal to ensure North Carolina's future on the global stage.


Dear Governor McCrory:

The City of Elizabeth City is very pleased to learn that you have proposed the Connect NC bond initiative. This \$2.85 billion bond issue will insure that the State of North Carolina will be able to compete, not just within the United States, but globally as well in the years to come. The City of Elizabeth City is grateful that Connect NC will not require a tax increase for our citizens nor will it impact the full faith and credit of our state. In addition, your timing for this initiative could not occur at a better time, as interest rates remain at historical lows.

This program is designed in a manner, which will benefit all regions of our state. 

According to the 2015 population estimates released by the U.S. Census Bureau, North Carolina surpassed Michigan to become the ninth most populous state. The Census data shows that North Carolina remains an attractive state for both retirees and new professionals. The state is growing significantly faster than average and demographers expect this trajectory to continue.


Our rapidly-growing state population presents critical infrastructure needs. To keep up with the needs and challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century, we must take advantage of historically low interest rates by issuing long-term financing. We are requesting two bonds of \$1.4 billion each that will support investment in our state's transportation and other public infrastructure to cultivate a stronger economy and improved quality of life.

There is no better time for this targeted, long-term investment in our state's future, which will be approved by the voters through a referendum and which will not in any way imperil our state's pristine credit ratings.

### The need is clear

- New school facilities and superior roads and bridges are long-term investments in the state's future that will support our growth and make North Carolina more attractive to businesses and residents.
- This is a targeted, long-term investment to upgrade and maintain our state's critical infrastructure.

## **Long-term financing is the tool**

- Long-term financing is the most efficient way to fund critical need projects.
- North Carolina has an established and successful history of responsibly using long-term financing for infrastructure that supports the needs of a growing state population and economy.


## **Fiscally responsible and conservative**

- We are paying for 50-year assets with 20-year money at historically low interest rates.
- North Carolina will not do anything to jeopardize our Triple A credit ratings by all three ratings agencies – the bonds have been sized to be well within current debt affordability, as recently determined by the State Treasurer.
- The state's pristine "Triple Triple A" credit rating keeps the cost of financing projects low.

## **Now is the time to invest in our future**

- Interest rates are lower for public financing than they have ever been previously; if we are ever going to issue debt, now is the time.

## **Statewide solutions**


- Strategic investments have been selected considering agency priority, the size of the project and location.
